CLASSROOM PROCEDURES

Daily Required Materials: Charged Chromebook, US History folder, and pencils.

Google Classroom: All assignments are posted here and will be submitted here as well. If a student is absent, they can locate the work that was missed by looking at Google Classroom. Please keep in mind that Google Classroom is an extension of the classroom. Anything posted in Google Classroom will be treated as though it were stated openly during class. Parents should use the Teacher Connection page to view assignment due dates.

Bell Ringer/Dismissal: During the first several minutes of class, students will follow instructions for completing the bell ringer assignment.

Make-up Work: Absent students should check google classroom for make-up work. It is the student's responsibility to complete missed classwork, turn in homework or, to request to take a missed test the day of their return from the absence. To receive credit for missed work due to an absence, a student must turn in assignments upon returning to school within the number of days missed plus one day. However, any assignment that has a previously determined due date must be observed unless arrangements have been made with the assigning teacher.

Late Work: Students are expected to complete all assignments and submit them on or before the day it is due. Any work submitted the day after it was due will earn, at best, a score of 60%. Work submitted two or more days after the due date will not be accepted.

Dismissal: When the classroom is in order and all students are in their seats, Ms. Fabiano will dismiss you to leave – not the bell.
